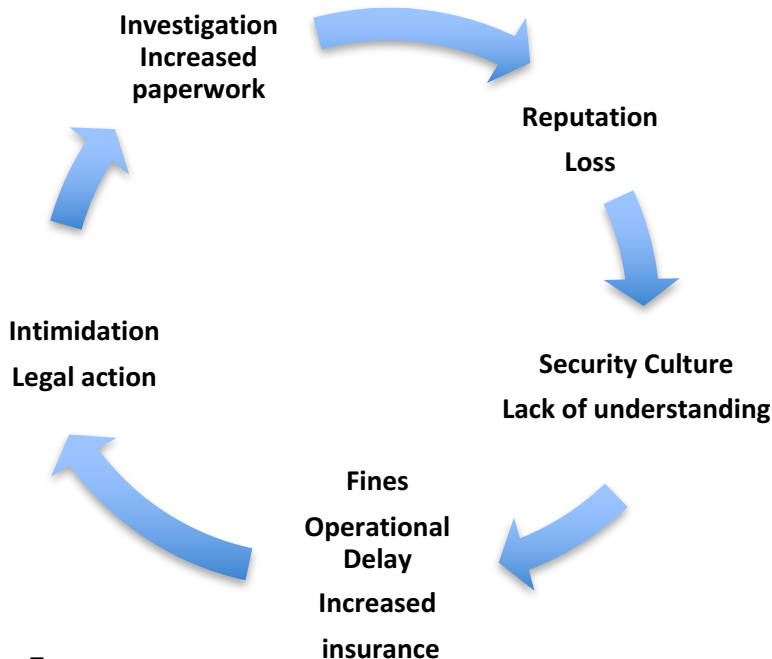

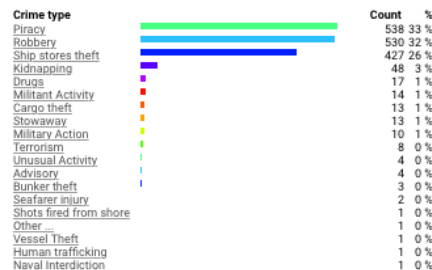

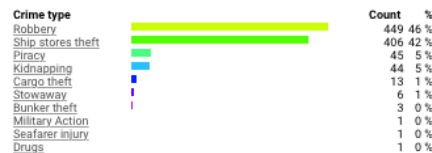

Attack and Incident Reports per Crimetype



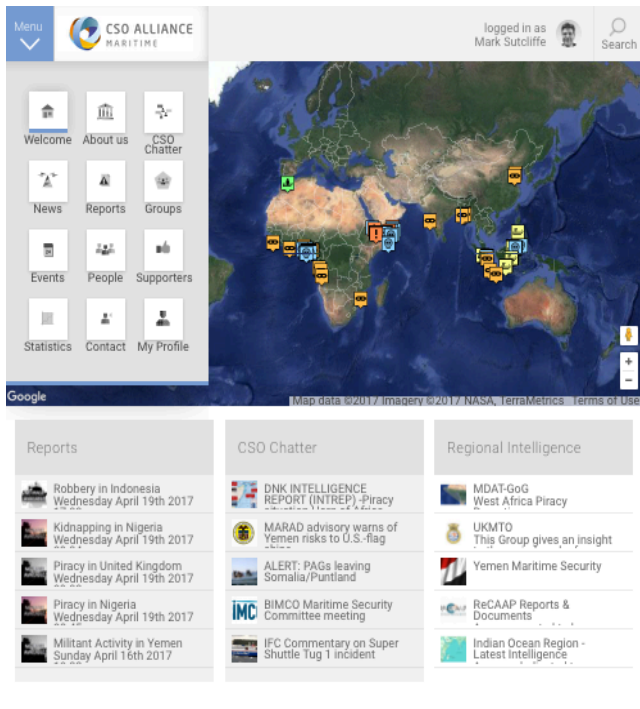
Total amount of reports: 1,636

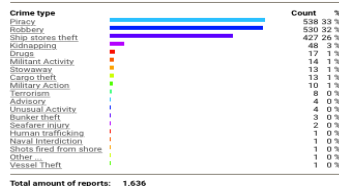

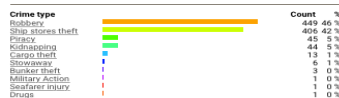
